Loving The Lake

Arguably, the greatest asset that Lake Lucerne Estates has is the lake itself. While its constant care and upkeep takes a combined community effort, there are many steps each of us, as individuals, can take to ensure we are doing our part to maintain the health, vitality, and beauty of the lake for many years to come.

If you live on the lake or a stream feeding the lake, plant a buffer strip of native plants along the water. If you have a lawn, keep it small and don't use fertilizers and pesticides.

Make sure your septic system functions properly and meets current standards.

Go slow in your boat. Big wakes erode shorelines.

When you buy a boat motor, remember that only electric motors are allowed on the lake.

Plant a rain garden, use a rain barrel to catch water from your roof, consider using permeable pavement in your driveway – runoff that stays on your property will not wash contaminants into feeder streams or the lake.

In the winter, use less salt on your sidewalks and driveway. Let our public officials know you support efforts to reduce the amount of road salt applied to roads and bridges. Chloride from road salt can build up in lakes that receive runoff from highways.

If you fish, consider putting away your lead sinkers and jigs and switching to non-toxic tackle.

Meet the Teacher & More

Parents of children that will be attending Mountain Park Elementary are encouraged to stop by Mountain Park Elementary on Thursday, August 2nd from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm for their annual 'Meet the Teacher'! Not only can you meet your teacher, but lots of other information will be available including bus routes, PTA memberships, and more.

And if you are new to Gwinnett County Public Schools you should complete online registration as part of the enrollment process. Once your online registration is complete, head over to the school office with the additional paperwork and they will help you finish registering your child.

Mountain Park Elementary is located at 1500 Pounds Road in Lilburn. The school opened in the fall of 1966 and has served a population

as small as 370 in grades 1-7 and as high as 1,024 in grades K-5. The school, which originally had 14 classrooms, was built to relieve overcrowding at Snellville Elementary. At that time, the school served a section of the county presently within the attendance zones of Arcado Elementary, Camp Creek Elementary, Mountain Park Elementary, and Lilburn Elementary. All of the above schools were built in later years to relieve Mountain Park Elementary School. By 1995, the enrollment grew to 633 students in grades K-5.

The current enrollment is approximately 600 students. The school has had three additions to the building, as well as a renovation to the original building. Mountain Park Elementary, which was named for the local community of Mountain Park, has a quiet, serene campus conducive to learning.

Gwinnett County Senior Services provides a variety of programs and services for Gwinnett County seniors, designed to enhance the quality of their lives and maintain their independence. These services also assist the families of seniors with their caregiving duties. To fulfill the needs of Gwinnett County residents, Senior Services offers the following services:

HOME DELIVERED MEALS

This service assists seniors who are homebound or unable to prepare their own meals. Meals on Wheels delivers frozen, chilled, or hot meals on a regular basis Monday through Friday. The meals are tailored to meet the nutritional needs of seniors. For inquiries about eligibility to receive meals, call 678.377.4150. For information on becoming a

HOMEMAKING

This service helps to meet life's basic needs through light house-keeping. For information, call 678.377.4150.

IN-HOME RESPITE CARE

The Respite Program is designed for those with or without dementia. It provides caregivers of seniors a break from caring for their loved ones. For information, call 678.377.4150.

SENIOR ACTIVITY CENTERS

Gwinnett senior activity centers are located in Buford, Lawrenceville, and Norcross. The centers function as community gathering places for adults 60 and older. Seniors partici-

pate in daily planned programming activities such as exercise and dance classes, arts and crafts, table games, billiards and day trip excursions. The centers host various guests who perform and entertain or speak about medical, financial, and consumer issues important to seniors. Senior clients also receive hot, balanced lunches Monday through Friday. There are no membership fees but some classes and day trips may have small fees.

TRANSPORTATION

Limited transportation is available to seniors who need assistance commuting to and from senior centers, medical appointments, and treatments. Vehicles used to transport seniors are wheelchair accessible. For information, call 678.377.4150.

other waterfowl are susceptible to contracting lead poisoning from tackle they pick up off lake bottoms.

Don't use the lake as a bathtub. Soaps and shampoos contain nutrients and pollutants that are harmful to the lake and organisms living in it.

Learn as much as you can about lakes and the threats they face. A good place to start is "Guide to Lake Protection and Management," a 27-page brochure published by the Freshwater Society in cooperation with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.
